Why be Lutheran?

Why are you Lutheran? There are many answers that we would give. *"It was the way I was raised."* *"It is my heritage."* *"I tried other churches and this one feels right."* *"I agree with*

Lutheran theology." If your answer has something to do with 'Jello' maybe you should keep it to yourself. Or maybe

your answer is not really about being Lutheran as much as it is about your specific congregation. Whatever the answer, it is important.

Sometimes our answer to "Why be Lutheran?" has been more about being right than anything else. Sometimes our answer has separated us from others rather than drawing others to Jesus. Paul, when writing to

the church in Corinth used the body as an image for understanding how we are to get along.

"For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being

I Corinthians 12:12

many, are one body, so also is Christ. ¹³ For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. ¹⁴ For in fact the body is not one member but many. ¹⁵ If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? ¹⁶ And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would be the hearing? If the

whole were hearing, where would be the smelling? ¹⁸ But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased. ¹⁹ And if they were all one member, where would the body be? ²⁰ But now indeed there are many members, yet one body.

1 Corinthians 12:12-20

We seem content to think of this as an image for the congregation, each with our different gifts. And we probably find it easier deciding what

specific church members represent different “body parts”. But this is also an image of the larger church. Those who call on the name of Jesus, and seek to show the world the love of God express themselves in a huge variety of ways. When asked “Why be Lutheran?”, if our answer is because we are right, and someone else is wrong, then we are like **“The eye that says to the hand, “I have no need of you”** (see v. 21) But we need our Christian brothers and sisters just

as much as a body needs all its parts.

Being Lutheran is important to me. I love our theology, the way we read scripture, and our worship. Being Lutheran makes us unique, and important in “the body”, but the same is true of every part of the Body of Christ!

Why be Lutheran? Your answer matters.

MATTHEW 28:1-10

After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb.

²There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. ⁴The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men.

⁵The angel said to the women, “Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. ⁶He is not here; he has risen, just as he said.

Come and see the place where he lay. ⁷Then go quickly and tell his disciples: ‘He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.’ Now I have told you.”

⁸So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹Suddenly Jesus met them. “Greetings,” he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰Then Jesus said to them, “Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me.”

We are in need of someone who can help one of our volunteers once or twice a month with the food pick-up at the food pantry in Hillsboro on Thursdays from 8:30am till about 10:30am.

Job description:

+ Meet at PVC by 8:30am and ride out to food pantry with one of our volunteers.

+ Help load up food into the truck and bring it back to PVC.

+ Unload food into the pantry here at PVC.

+ Be able to lift 40 to 50 lb. boxes.

+ Have 2 to 2 1/2 hours once or twice a month to volunteer.

We are also in need of a volunteer who has a vehicle who would be willing to pick up food from Whole Foods in Hillsboro once or twice a month on Fridays. You can pick up as early as 8am, but no later than 9:30am.

+ If items need to be refrigerated must be willing to put them in the refrigerator.


