In the last book of the Bible Jesus speaks to John in a vision and says...

"Behold, I make all things new." (Revelation 21:5)

And I think this must be what we are looking for. New Year. New calendar. New start!?! Is that what it is? Is the 1st of January a new start? A "do-over"? Or do we just wish for something different? When we get to the end of the year, or the beginning of the next, we usually gather. It may be a New Year's

Registration for the 2014-2015 school year will start January 15, 2014.

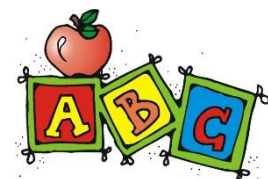
All new students need to have a registration form, filled out, and attached to the \$45 registration check (payable to CTK Preschool). Registration

Registration forms will be available at the Open House.



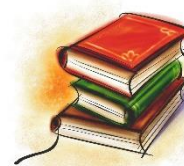
LIBRARY NEWS

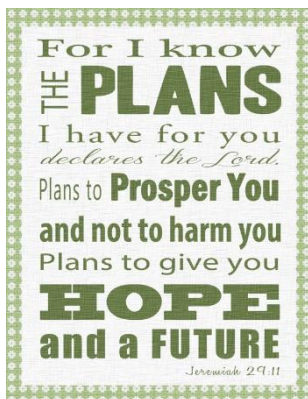
Human and community needs
