shared myself with you, and it has been an honor for me to be let into your lives. You have allowed me to stand with you in sorrow and to celebrate your

joyous accomplishments. It has been a deep honor to be your pastor. Thank you.

So maybe the best I can do is turn to scripture and use the words that have been a part of our experience as Christians for so many generations. As I thank God for our time together I know that I am not the first to feel this way. The apostle Paul in addressing the early church in Philippi, might as well be speaking for me.

COUNCIL NEWS



We will be celebrating Pastor
Kallevig's time with us and saying
goodbye on September 14 at a
special Luncheon (see the
announcement below). Your
Church Council hopes to see you
all there because it is important
that we as individuals and as a
congregation give Pastor Jeff
and family our best wishes and
that he goes with our blessing.

In the meantime, your Church
Council has already met with the
Bishop's representative and
together we are in the process of
selecting an Interim Pastor. For
those Sundays following Pastor
Jeff's departure and before the
Interim starts, we will be served by
supply Pastors, likely, some of the
same faces you have seen
before. If you have suggestions,
let me know.
The Interim Pastor will have two

important functions. First, is to
provide all necessary Pastoral
services previously done by
Pastor Jeff. Second, is lead us
through the Call Process which
will take several months. In our
meeting last week with Assistant
Bishop Kintner (she related that
the Oregon Synod has gone
through 85 Pastoral calls in the
last six years) she suggested we
should expect to be at a point of
extending a call to a new Pastor
as soon as this time next year. So,
we have lots of work to do as a
congregation and we will work
together to make it happen.
In the meantime, Christ the King
Lutheran church will continue to
function as it always has because
we, as the family of CTK, want it
so. We will have the same
maintenance issues, dreams,
expenses and demands that we
have always had. Therefore, your
continued full support and
attention is needed now to
ensure we meet the needs of
our CTK family. The Council will
continue to keep you informed
of the administrative news and
health of CTK as we have in the
past. Now is **not** the time to let
our Stewardship (time, talents
and financial support) fade. For
us to be successful we must all
be willing and active
participants in what lies ahead.
