RIC(Reconciling In Christ)Public Partner Commitments

- 1. Your community explicitly states a welcome to people of "all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions" or "LGBTQIA+ people" and names its commitment to "racial equity" or "anti-racism" in its welcome statement.
- 2. **Open to calling** an LGBTQIA+ or Black, Brown, Indigenous, Person of Color (BIPOC) Rostered Leader.
- 3. Will allow community space/sanctuary to be used for LGBTQIA+ weddings and blessings.
- 4. Will make a meaningful contribution annually to support the national RIC program.

*If this motion is passed, then Christ the KIng Lutheran Church/Cristo Rey Iglesia Luterana will be added to the RIC Roster list, so people searching will know we are a welcoming and safe place for all kinds of "all." The Public statements, and our welcome statements are a reflection of Martin Luther, and defines "What does this mean? (to be an RIC church).
