Remember you are dust.

By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19).

My sister told me she was not afraid to be dead, she was just a little uneasy about the transition from breathing to not breathing, that point when the human body transcends the thin veil and becomes dust. She and I shared an affinity for the season of Lent because we held onto the hope of the Easter resurrection.

What does the church have to say to the hundreds of thousands of families whose loved ones have died from this horrific pandemic in the past year? What does the church have to say to the hundreds of thousands of people who are struggling financially? What does the church have to say about injustice and insurrection? We have a lot to say because we have the hope of the Easter resurrection.

ELCA Bishop Rick Jaech shared his wisdom on these questions recently and I want to share it with you as we continue to

wrestle with what it means to be church for the world and church in the world.

"Surrounded by turmoil and violence in our nation, it is more important than ever for Christ's church to be a visible, public church. Filled with God's grace and Spirit, we are set free to courageously bring God's love, healing, and justice to all around us".

Drawing from the writings of Dr. Cynthia Moe-Lobeda, professor at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, Bishop Jaech calls on three core tenets of Lutheranism:

- 1. We are God's beloved
- 2. We are broken
- 3. We are bearers of God's love for all creation

When confronted by the realities of the human condition of brokenness, the church, through the Word of God brings us back to the love of God in Christ Jesus that is ours to claim. Not only for ourselves, but for all humans, indeed, all of creation. Dear church, we cannot ignore the world around us. The world is hurting and hungry for the promise of Easter resurrection. We have the good news. We must not keep it for ourselves.

As you mark the dust on your forehead this Lent, do not give up something. Take on something. Tell one person each week that they are God's beloved. Invite one person to join you at church, on Zoom. Call one person you have argued with just to say hello. Be creative. Be the church. Be the bearer of God's love for the sake of the world.

LENT 2021

"The Gospel According to Jesus' Enemies"

Imagine lining up the enemies of Jesus and asking them why they said what they did about him; why they did what they did to him. Imagine no longer. Dann Ettner has done exactly that.

Along with an order of worship, which includes a responsive dialogue, a "Gospel Drama" and original lyrics to a familiar hymn tune, Ettner has created six monologues portraying the enemies of Jesus. Each character asks us to consider why he did what he did and "what would you do"?

The characters we will meet are:

Ash Wednesday, February 17 th	Caiaphas, the High Priest
February 24 th	An Arresting Soldier
March 3 rd	A Member of the Crowd Who Shouted Crucify Him
March 10 th	Pilate
March 17 th	The Centurion
March 24 th	The Grave Guard

These services and testimonials are meant to take us into the action so that we can judge for ourselves how God moved these enemies of Jesus to unwittingly speak words of truth about the Son of God. The series was written in 1957 by Dann J Ettner, a lieutenant in the US Air Force and a Lutheran pastor in California. The book was reprinted in 1995. The monologues are the creation of Pastor Ettner. Some of the language may sound a bit dated, yet, the truth of the gospel never gets old.

VACCINATION INFORMATION

Vaccinations are underway in Oregon, and some of you may be wondering when and how you will be able to get yours. Here is some information I've found that may be useful to you. First, you'll need an appointment. Until February 7, the only people who can make an appointment are health and home care providers, people living in group settings or who need health providers to come to their homes regularly, and educators.

People over 80 will be eligible the week of Feb.7; over 75, Feb. 14; over 70, Feb. 21, and over 65, Feb. 28. You will not be able to sign up until the week eligibility begins for you.

When you become eligible, go to the Oregon Health Authority's vaccine scheduling tool, <u>https://covidvaccine.oregon.gov</u>. This site will ask you some questions and then connect you to the scheduling system. Scroll down to Vaccine Eligibility & FAQ Tool and click on the "Let's get started" button, or use the pop-up window in the lower right corner of the page. Even though you might be eligible, you may not get an appointment for several weeks. The scheduling system can only handle 1,000 people at a time, so you may have to try back several times and once appointments are full for the week you will have to try again the next week. Hope it goes easily for you!=

My Faith Journey by Sherman Case

I first got involved with Reconciling in Christ in the late 1990s at St. Luke Lutheran Church in SW Portland. A family whose oldest son came out as gay as a college freshman requested that the congregation look at becoming an RIC congregation. I volunteered to be part of the exploratory group. We ultimately decided that our congregation was not ready at that time. While we felt that the goal of becoming welcoming to the gay & lesbian communities (there were not the Alphabet communities identified then that are identified now) was desirable to the majority of the members, we recognized the welcoming statement would be problematic for a minority of the members, and that they probably would be quite vocal and a congregational fracture would be one of the likely outcomes.

Fast forward to 20+ years later, and I am again a member of a Reconciling in Christ exploratory group. Some things have changed, and some haven't. One thing that has changed is that in my last go-around, I didn't start out knowing exactly how I felt about the issue of homosexuality and the teachings of the Bible, but now I do. I attended church and Sunday School as a child, but those teachings weren't on the agenda. I drifted away from the church, and it wasn't until I had children that I really returned. As a newly baptized adult when I volunteered for the first exploratory group, I got to look at the teachings with new eyes. There are several Bible passages that are used to condemn homosexuality, and RIC teaching materials can give you reasons why each of those teachings does not condemn homosexuality. I read the reasoning's, and found most of them to be convincing, but a couple of them, quite frankly, used what one of my college professors called "Philadelphia lawyering", meaning that they used convoluted reasoning that felt less convincing. This led me to question what I should be doing. After much praying and thinking about it over the 20+ years, here is what I've come up with – I don't why these passages are in the Bible, but I don't think we are interpreting or using them correctly. I'm thinking Pastor Dorothy might tell me that I'm not really understanding the explanations, but my position is that I do not really care. The couple things I really do understand from the Bible is that Jesus Christ died for our sins, and that He commanded us to love one another. If reaching out to our LGBQTIA+ brothers, sisters, and others is wrong, then on my judgement day, I will answer Jesus that I am a sinner, I did my best, and that's why he had to die for me. I ask that you all search your hearts to find you own ways to accept all our fellow Christians and to profess that without reservation.
