When Thoughts and Prayers Aren't Enough

Pray and then pray some more and then pray without ceasing. Pray for the sick, the homeless, the widow, the orphan, the dying, the war-ravaged. And then pray for the leaders, ALL the leaders. Well, God, I don't want to pray for corrupt leaders. I don't want to pray for evil leaders. I don't want to pray for demigods and oppressors. And God says: pray, pray for them all: *I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings and all those in authority,* screamed: *"How long, O Lord?"* A lament from our Black and Brown-bodied siblings daily is, *How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?* (Psalm 13). This may be the best prayer to pray right now.

I am no longer content offering thoughts and prayers in the wake of this carnage. I want you to know what your pastor is up to. The week following that shooting in Buffalo, NY, I dragged my life-long best friend with me to the sidewalk outside the King City Safeway where

that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness

(1 Timothy 2:1,2). But, the warmongers are destroying peaceful, quiet lies. Do I really have to pray for them, too? **As I was writing** this newsletter article on May 24, horror was unfolding in Uvalde, TX: 19 children and 2 adults are dead inside Robb Elementary School. I cannot be silent! I will pray, out loud, in public. I will stand outside Albertson's, Safeway, and any other public location gathering signatures for Oregon IP #17. Stop by my office to sign the petition. It will also be available on Sunday mornings. We cannot remain silent! We cannot hide behind so-called separation of church and state. We are called to speak the truth...the massacres of God's beloved must stop. —PD we began gathering signatures to get Initiative Petition #17 put on the November 2022 Oregon ballot. I will be standing in grocery store parking lots for the next few weeks doing this. You see, I am safe in a grocery store parking in Putfelo

Yes, we have to pray for them, too. We don't necessarily have to set aside our opinions about the atrocities being perpetrated by some leaders. But, we are commanded to pray for all leaders, and, I believe that includes the ones we think are bad leaders. I mean, I'm fairly certain that John the Baptist's prayers for Herod were colorful, to say the least. I'm sure he gave God an earful about that corrupt leader. But, still, John prayed, even while imprisoned by Herod.

How do we pray for our enemies? What do we say to God? Look no further than the Psalms of lament. These are the Psalms that cry out to God in moments of despair. *Out of the depths l cry to you, Lord; let your ears be attentive to my cry for mercy* (Psalm 130).

God *is* attentive to our cries for mercy...mercy for ourselves and mercy for those who are in harm's way. When I heard the news of another massacre of Black bodies, this time in a grocery store parking lot, I lot...unlike those men and women in Buffalo.

One of the key figures driving this initiative is The Rev. Dr. Mark Knutson, pastor at **Augustana Lutheran Church**, Portland. Pr. Knutson inspired me, by his example of selfless leadership in the public square, to get out and do something, even something small.

To find out more about this initiative and the organization behind it, go to Lift Every Voice Oregon— Reduce Gun Violence. The title of the organization is taken from the well-known South African freedom song "Lift Every Voice and Sing." You can read the lyrics in our Lutheran hymnals—Lutheran Book of Worship #562; Evangelical Lutheran Worship #841—or search the internet for recordings and printed lyrics. The final phrase of the first verse sums up our never-ending call to justice in the public arena: *"let us march on till victory is won."* Peace, safety, and blessings to you all,

Relief for Ukraine

The headline in a recent publication from Lutheran World Relief reads: *Your Love Is Helping Ukrainian Refugees in Lutheran Church Shelter.* Pastor Lukasz Ostruszka of St. Martin's Lutheran Church, Krakow, Poland, was asked, "What do you need?" His answer was simple, "supplies." Supplies that would allow his congregation to welcome and care for Ukrainian refuges. The supplies the church was able to purchase included toys and milk for the children, toothpaste and toothbrushes, hygiene products, toiletries, energy bars, and so much more.

St. Martin's has converted their basement meeting spaces into shelter space for 25-30 refugees at a time. The congregation gave up their seldom-used Sunday School rooms so families, widows, and orphans could have a "place to sleep, to be warm." They renovated the bathrooms to include showers and privacy for families.

Your generous, "noisy" offering added nearly \$800 to LWR's fundraising drive for Ukrainian relief. The need continues as the war rages on in Ukraine. Please consider even a small regular contribution for LWR. When our small offerings are added together, we can make a difference.
