Thursday, April 1, 2021 Maundy Thursday

Introduction

This evening our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. Tonight we remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, and the central focus of his commandment that we live out the promise embodied in this meal. As Jesus washed his disciples' feet, so we are called to give and receive love in humble service to one another. Formed into a new body in Christ through this holy meal, we are transformed by God's mercy. We end the worship in silence as we await the coming days.

Confession and Forgiveness

Friends in Christ, in this Lenten season we have heard our Lord's call to struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were called at baptism. Within the community of the church, God never wearies of forgiving sin and giving the peace of reconciliation. On this night let us confess our sin against God and our neighbor, and enter the celebration of the great Three Days reconciled with God and with one another.

Silence is kept for reflection and self-examination.

Most merciful God, we confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen.

God, who is rich in mercy, loved us even when we were dead in sin, and made us alive together with Christ. By grace you have been saved. In the name of + Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. Almighty God strengthen you with power through the Holy Spirit, that Christ may live in your hearts through faith. **Amen.**



 All these things we ask in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.





The service concludes with the chanting of Psalm 22 while the worship space is stripped of all sacred icons. If you wish to replicate this tradition:

Gather any faith related items you have in your home – icons, statues, crosses, religious symbols and art that can easily be removed. Pack them away in a bag or bin, cover large items with a cloth.

Remove all items from your table so it is completely empty and thoroughly wash it so it is both cleared and clean. Leave your table bare until Easter morning when you unpack and uncover your religious items and decorate your room table with Easter joy.

Friday, April 2, 2021 Good Friday

Introduction

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday. In John's passion account, Jesus reveals the power and glory of God, even as Jesus is put on trial and sentenced to death. Standing with the disciples at the foot of the cross, we pray for the whole world as Christ's death offers life to all. We gather in solemn



devotion, but always with the promise that the tree around which we assemble is indeed a tree of life. We depart silently, and we anticipate the culmination of the Three Days in the Great Easter Vigil and the Glorious Resurrection.

Prayer of the Day

Merciful God, your Son was lifted up on the cross to draw all people to himself. Grant that we who have been born out of his wounded side may at all times find mercy in him.

If you have a cross in your home, set it in a place of prominence as we express our adoration for the cross of Christ.



Solemn Reproaches

The Solemn Reproaches is an ancient text of Western Christianity associated with the ending of the Good Friday service. The reproaches follow the pattern of Psalm 78, which recounts God's continuing acts of faithfulness and Israel's repeated rebellion. Each reproach calls to mind God's saving acts and concludes with the same words: "but you have prepared a cross for your Savior." Following each reproach, the assembly responds with a prayer for mercy, singing the Trisagion ("the thrice holy"). The service concludes with a hymn. The assembly leaves in silence.



Sisters and brothers in Christ, on this most holy night when our Savior, Jesus Christ passed from death to life, we gather with the church, scattered throughout the world and our communities in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of Jesus Christ. Through light and the word we proclaim Christ's death and resurrection, share Christ's triumph over sin and death and await Christ's coming again in glory.

Prayer of the Day

Eternal giver of life and light, this holy night shines with the radiance of the risen Christ. Renew your church in exile with the Spirit given us in baptism that we may worship you in sincerity and truth and may shine as a light in the world, wherever we are, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
