### **THANKSGIVING FOR BAPTISM**

Look, here is water!

**Here is our water of life! Alleluia!**

Immersed in the promises of baptism, let us give thanks for what God has done for us.

**We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your voice thundered over the deep and water became the essence of life. Adam and Eve beheld Eden's verdant rivers. The ark carried your creation through the flood into a new day. Miriam led the dancing as your people passed through the sea into freedom's land. In a desert pool the Ethiopian official entered your boundless baptismal life.**

Look, here is water!

**Here is our water of life! Alleluia!**

At the river your beloved Son was baptized and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you opened the floodgates of your reconciling love, freeing us to live as Easter people. We rejoice with glad hearts, giving all honor and praise to you, through the risen Christ, our source of living water, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

James Montgomery wrote this text for use at a Moravian settlement Christmas service in 1821 and later included it at the close of a speech delivered at a Liverpool, England, missionary meeting. Adam Clark, who was present at the meeting, was so impressed that he published it in his Bible commentary of 1822. Montgomery was one of England's greatest hymnwriters, ranking with John Wesley, Isaac Watts, John Newton, and William Cowper. He wrote and published more than 400 hymns in over 10 volumes; he also worked as a newspaper editor and teacher of poetry. This anonymous tune is named ELLACOMBE, an Anglo-Saxon word meaning island or coastal area (combe) of elves (ella). It first appeared in a Roman Catholic hymnal from Württemberg, Germany, in 1784. The tune name was supplied by an English hymnal editor.

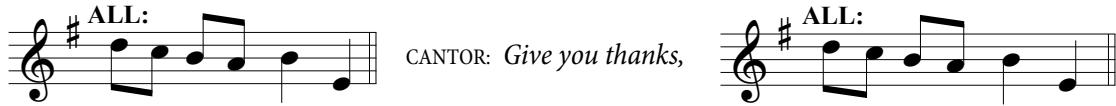

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## READING

ACTS 10:34-43

As a result of Peter's preaching, Cornelius and his family become the first Gentiles to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.*

A reading from Acts, the tenth chapter.

Peter began to speak to [Cornelius and his household]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every people anyone who fears him and practices righteousness is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

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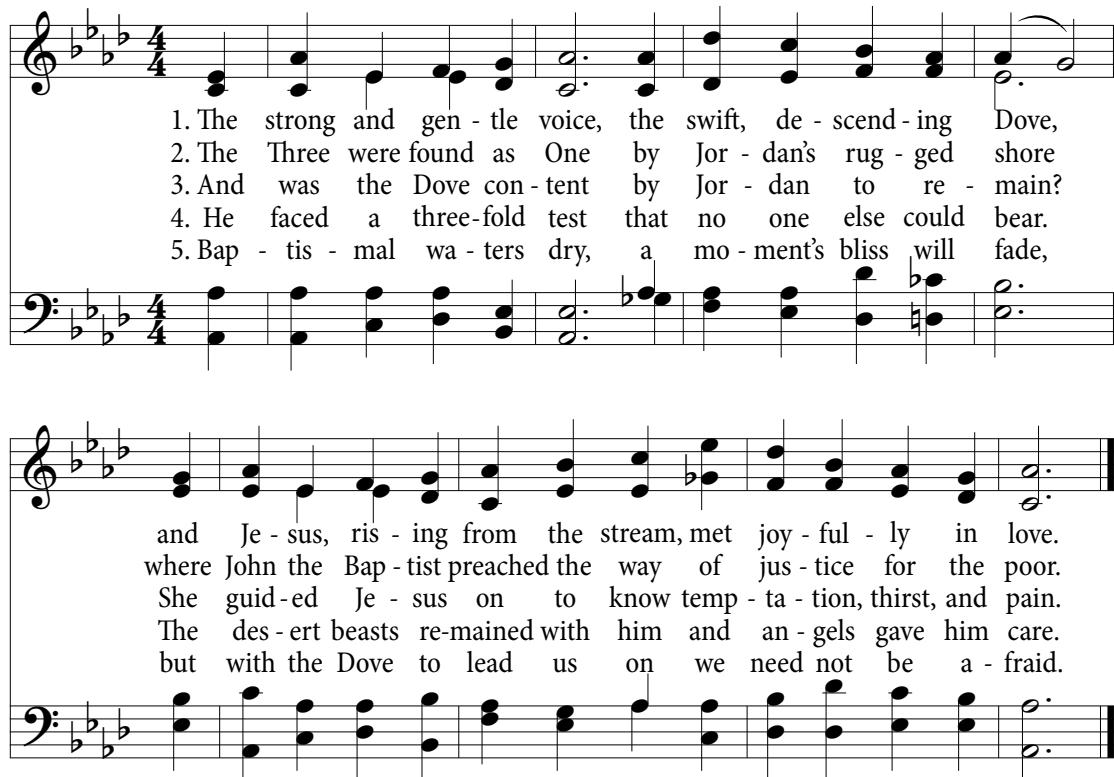
## HYMN OF THE DAY

William Chatterton Dix (1837-1898) wrote a longer Christmas poem, "The Manger Throne," from which this hymn is derived. It appeared in this form with the tune GREENSLEEVES in Christmas Carols New and Old (1871).

The old English tune has been traced to 1580. William Shakespeare mentioned the tune GREENSLEEVES in his play The Merry Wives of Windsor. There Shakespeare joked that it could not be used as a tune for singing Psalm 100. However, from its earliest reference in history, it has been used with both sacred and secular words.

We give you thanks for your dear Son: at the heart of human life; near to those who suffer; beside the sinner; among the poor; with us now.

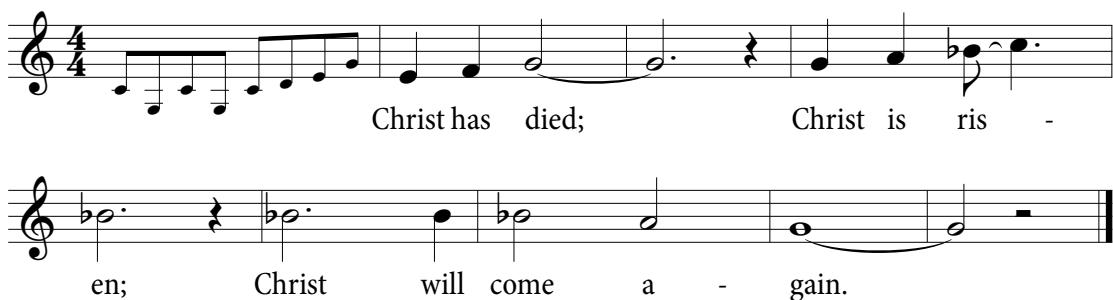

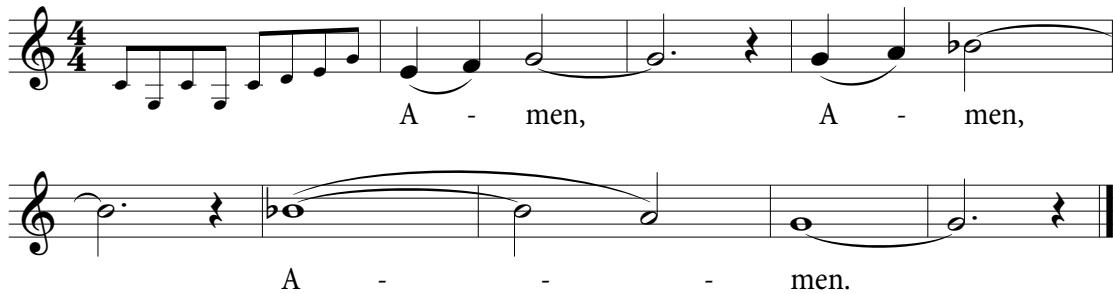

Ruth C. Duck was working on a revision of the traditional text "Rise Up, O Men of God" when this adaptation came to her in 1973. It marked the beginning of her involvement in hymnwriting. This was her first text to be accepted for publication in a denominational hymnal. Ruth Duck was an ordained pastor in the United Church of Christ, a liturgical theologian, and professor of worship who taught for 27 years at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois. She wrote more than 150 hymns, edited three books of sources for worship services, and wrote on the topic of Trinitarian theology, all with an eye toward facilitating the use of gender-inclusive language in the context of Christian worship. She was a leading champion for and developer of inclusive language worship sources. William Henry Walter composed the tune FESTAL SONG in 1872 for the hymn "Awake and Sing the Song." It was probably from this connection that the tune received its name. William Walter showed musical talent at an early age. While only a boy, he played the organ for two churches in Newark, New Jersey, where he was born. He later served as organist at various churches in New York City and was appointed organist at Columbia University in 1865.
