Will you come and follow Jesus?

Jesus asked them "what are you looking for?" They said to him, "where are you staying?" He said to them "Come and see." John 1:38-39

I recently heard of a church member who decided to quit giving to their church, saying, "Why should I throw money at an organization that is dying?" It made me sad. It made me angry. It made me think. Martin Luther is reported to have said, "If I knew the world was going to end tomorrow, I would plant an apple tree today." In other words, faith in God compels us to live with hope and courage. Withholding financial support based on worldly metrics just doesn't make sense. We have no fear because God is with us.

What would it sound like, though, if we reframe that member's statement—if we change the language? First, what if we call ourselves a *community*, not an *organization*. The church is a community, made up of real, breathing, living, caring people. An organization is not.

Second, let's not rely on unsubstantiated hearsay. "People are saying ..." is one of the least helpful phrases church folks use ... a LOT. Let's drop this phrase from our vocabulary. If there is a question about the health of this or any congregation, ask the leaders, the congregation council. This group of dedicated members of the community are committed to discovering creative solutions for the long-term well-being of the whole community. Let's all shift our language from scarcity and fear to abundance and joy.

Third, share the good news! I have told the glad news of deliverance ... Psalm 40:9. It is our job to invite everyone, not to convince anyone. Who have you told? Who will you invite to "come and see"?

The gospel is good news to all who hear it. We won't thrive unless we share the good news with all who we meet. It's no joke! When we boldly and enthusiastically admit where we spend our time, others will be curious.

My personal mantra, when tempted to spiral into thoughts of scarcity and fear, is these three words: "There is enough." This past year, more than ever, we have seen so clearly God answer our prayer, "give us this day our daily bread," providing exactly what we need, when we need it.

Ash Wednesday is February 22. Here is your Lenten challenge: Invite one person to come and see ... online or in person.
