GATHERING HYMN

Hope of the World

Georgia Harkness created this hymn to reflect the theme of the Second General Assembly of the World Council of Churches, held in Evanston, Illinois, in 1954—"Jesus Christ the Hope of the World." Harkness was ordained a Methodist minister in 1926 and had a celebrated career as a college and seminary professor. John Albert Jeffery composed ANCIENT OF DAYS in 1886. It was originally named ALBANY for the city in New York, which celebrated its bicentennial that year. Jeffery was born in Plymouth, England, and succeeded his father as organist at St. Andrew's Cathedral in that city. He moved to the United States in 1876 and taught at Albany, New York, and at the New England Conservatory of Music in Massachusetts.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

PSALM 121

A reading of Psalm 121.

I lift up my eyes to the hills; from where is my help to come?

My help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth.

God's call of Abram and Sarai has a clear purpose—that through them all the families of the earth would gain a blessing. As they set out on their journey, they are accompanied by promises of land, nation, and a great reputation.

The Lord will watch over your going out and your coming in, from this time forth forevermore.

In the person and example of Abraham we discover that a right relationship with God does not involve earning a reward from God but entails trusting God's promises. Abraham is the forebear and model for both Jews and Gentiles, because we too trust that ours is a God who gives life to the dead.

READING

ROMANS 4:1-5, 13-17

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans, the fourth chapter.

What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. For what does the scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness." Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift but as something due. But to one who does not work but trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness.

For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law, neither is there transgression.

For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace, so that it may be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (who is the father of all of us, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"), in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.

What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen, yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

Blessed are you, O God of the universe. Your mercy is everlasting and your faithfulness endures from age to age.



O God of resurrection and new life: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine. Bless this feast. Grace our table with your presence.



Since its first inclusion in a U.S. hymnal in the 1970s, this hymn has become enormously popular. In 1887, George W. Kitchin wrote the text on which this hymn is based for the festival of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Winchester Cathedral, England. Michael R. Newbolt, another Church of England minister, revised Kitchin's text in 1916, making it less militaristic. Composer Sydney Nicholson was organist of Westminster Abbey. He was knighted in 1938 for his contributions to English church music.

Your Invitation to two lenten disciplines. One: We gather weekly for study and reflection on five extraordinary people of the Easter story. Join us on Wednesdays at noon in the sanctuary. Each session will be about 40 minutes long with video, meditation, and conversation. Come and experience An Unlikely Lent.

Two: **"Feed My Sheep,"** Jesus instructed Peter. (John 1) We will do just that. Each week we will gather non-perishable items based on a particular theme or meal. Use your imagination as you gather *one item per day* to add to the grocery bag/box. Look especially in the "Spanish/Latino" food aisle. Many of the shoppers at Packed With Pride are Latino. Remember what Jesus said, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat" (Matthew 25:42).

Let this list spark your imagination!

February 22: *Breakfast ingredients:* cereal, powdered milk, oatmeal, etc.

March 1: *Lunch ingredients:* crackers, canned tuna, canned soup, tortillas, etc.

March 8: *Personal hygiene products:* toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, facial or toilet tissue

March 15: *Dinner ingredients:* boxed meals, canned stew and chili, spaghetti sauces, rice, etc.

March 22: *Dessert ingredients:* flour, sugar, cake mixes, canned frosting, powdered sugar, etc

March 29: *Spices:* cooking oil, salt, pepper, parsley, sage, rosemary, thyme, etc.
