

Marty Haugen wrote this text in 1994 for the Roman Catholic Community of St. Thomas Becket in Eagan, Minnesota. Although it was written for the church's dedication. this text is not about a physical structure but a spiritual one. It originally had 13 stanzas and was intended to reflect the rite of "gathering-word-mealending." Marty Haugen is a prolific liturgical composer with many songs included in hymnals across the liturgical spectrum of North American hymnals and beyond. Several of his songs have been translated into other languages. He was raised in the American Lutheran Church and received a BA in psychology from Luther College and an MA in pastoral studies at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. A number of liturgical settings were prepared for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and more than 400 of his compositions have been published. He continues to compose and travel to speak and teach at worship

events around the world.




THE HOMILY PASTOR TOM STRUCK

Jesus teaches his disciples that true purity is a matter of the heart rather than outward religious observances. Almost immediately, this teaching is tested when a woman considered to be a religious outsider approaches him for help.

Carolyn Winfrey Gillette is a Presbyterian minister and hymnwriter. She wrote "She Came to Jesus" for the 35th anniversary celebration of the ordination of the Rev. Dr. Dorothea Brooks. It is based on the sermon text for that worship service—and today's gospel lesson—Matthew 15:21-28. This traditional Irish tune accompanied a folk song that began "With my love on the road." The name of the tune, SLANE, refers to a hill outside of the community of Tara, County Meath, Ireland. It was on this hill that Saint Patrick lit the Paschal fire and challenged the authority of the pagan king.




EUCHARISTIC PRAYER



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



John Oxenham was the pen name of British business professional William J. Dunkerly (1852-1941), who took up writing to occupy his mind during extensive business travels. Scholars believe that he wrote this text as a response to wellknown lines by Rudyard Kipling,"Oh, East is East, and West is West, and never the twain shall meet" from "The Ballad of East and West." This hymn celebrates the universality of God's family that transcends any human constructs. Harry T. Burleigh adapted this tune from a spiritual, "I Know the Angel's Done Changed My Name." It is named McKEE for the minister of St. George's Protestant Episcopal Church in New York City. Burleigh, grandson of a Maryland slave, was baritone soloist at this church for 52 years.
