The Department of International Affairs of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A. invited the Hymn Society of America to seek new hymns for the Fifth World Order Study Conference held in Cleveland in November 1958. This one by William W. Reid Jr. was the first choice from over 200 submissions. Reid was a minister at Methodist churches in Pennsylvania, superintendent of the Wilkes-Barre district of the United Methodist Church, and a delegate to Methodist conferences. LLANGLOFFAN is a traditional Welsh melody. Its first publication has been traced to Llwybrau Moliant (1872), a Baptist tune collection. Some scholars believe that the tune may have spread from England to Wales in the 18th or 19th century. The title may refer to the "Church of St. Gloffan." GATHERING HYMN ELW 713

### **WORD**

**READING** ISAIAH 65:1-9

A reading from the prophet Isaiah, the sixty-fifth chapter.

I was ready to be sought out by those who did not ask, to be found by those who did not seek me. I said, "Here I am, here I am," to a nation that did not call on my name. I held out my hands all day long to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own devices; a people who provoke me to my face continually, sacrificing in gardens and offering incense on bricks; who sit inside tombs and spend the night in secret places; who eat the flesh of pigs, with broth of abominable things in their vessels; who say, "Keep to yourself; do not come near me, for I am too holy for you." These are a smoke in my nostrils, a fire that burns all day long. See, it is written before me: I will not keep silent, but I will repay; I will indeed repay into their laps their iniquities and their ancestors' iniquities together, says the Lord; because they offered incense on the mountains and reviled me on the hills, I will measure into their laps full payment for their actions.

Thus says the Lord: As the wine is found in the cluster, and they say, "Do not destroy it, for there is a blessing in it," so I will do for my servants' sake and not destroy them all. I will bring forth descendants from Jacob and from Judah inheritors of my mountains; my chosen shall inherit it, and my servants shall settle there.

#### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM**

For dominion belongs to the Lord, who rules over the nations.

**READING** GALATIANS 3:23-29

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Galatians, the third chapter.

Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be reckoned as righteous by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek; there is no longer slave or free; there is no longer male and female, for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.



**HOLY GOSPEL** LUKE 8:26-39

Jesus' mission includes foreigners and his authority extends to the casting out of demons. Some who witness Jesus' work are seized with confusion and fear, but the man who was healed is commissioned to give testimony to God's mercy and power.

Then [Jesus and his disciples] arrived at the region of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. As he stepped out on shore, a man from the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had not worn any clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him, shouting, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me," for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" He said, "Legion," for many demons had entered him. They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss.

Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding, and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd stampeded down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.

When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country. Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they became frightened. Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. Then the whole throng of people of the surrounding region of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them, for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone out begged that he might be with him, but Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.




Horatius Bonar wrote this text in a notebook he always carried with him when walking or traveling. It was written while he was at his first charge, North Parish at Kelso, Scotland, and appeared in his Hymns Original and Selected (1846). Bonar received his education at the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. Ralph Vaughan Williams harmonized this traditional English melody for The English Hymnal (1906). It was named KINGSFOLD for the village in Sussex, England, where the tune was documented.

Graham Kendrick revels here in the feast God provides with trumpets, welcome, thankful song, lavish good things, love and light, and water turned to wine. Kendrick, the son of a Baptist minister in Northamptonshire, is one of the most prolific Christian singer-songwriters in the United Kingdom. Since releasing his first album in 1972, he has written and recorded more than 450 songs. Kendrick has received honorary doctorates in divinity from Brunel University and Wycliffe College. In 1987 he helped co-found the March for Jesus, which today is a global phenomenon in which Christians take their faith to the streets in a celebration of Christ. In 1995 Kendrick received a Dove Award for his international work.




#### **EUCHARISTIC PRAYER**



Daniel Iverson wrote this hymn after hearing a sermon at the George T. Stephans evangelistic revival meeting held at Orlando, Florida, in 1926. Ordained a Presbyterian minister, Iverson founded Shenandoah Presbyterian Church in Miami, Florida, where he served from 1927 until his retirement in 1951. Michael Baughen added a second stanza to the text in 1980. That stanza's emphasis on the Spirit moving "among us all," provides a complement to the first stanza's focus on the Spirit's work in the individual ("fall afresh on me"). The stanzas were first published together in the **British** Hymns for Today's Church (1982). Baughen was a priest in the Church of England since 1964 and Bishop of Chester from 1982 until he retired in 1996.



John Oxenham wrote this hymn as part of the libretto for the "Pageant of Darkness and Light," which was performed during a missionary exhibition in London, England, in 1905. John Oxenham was the pen name of an English businessman named William A. Dunkerley. His success in writing novels and religious works brought his other career to an end, and, beginning in 1913, he devoted all his time to his literary pursuits. He also wrote under the name Julian Ross. Alexander Robert Reinagle composed this tune in 1836 as a solo setting for Psalm 118 when he was organist at St. Peter-inthe-East Church in Oxford, England, where he served for 31 years. During his time there, he gave organ lessons to the likes of John Stainer.
