
Faithful God,

GATHERING HYMN ELW 796

John Rippon published A Selection of Hymns from the Best Authors (1787), a hymnbook of collected works by Watts and others. The hymnal became a standard for **English Baptist churches** and was very successful in the United States as well. The unknown author of this hymn is identified only by the initial "K," although later editions of Rippon's Selections credit "Kn" and "Keen." This has led many to speculate that it may have been written by R. Keene, the precentor in Rippon's church who wrote the tune with which the hymn first appeared. FOUNDATION is an anonymous early American melody that appeared with this text in several tune collections from the southern United States.

Some members of the Thessalonian community, because of their belief in the nearness of Christ's return, had ceased to work, living off the generosity of other members of the community. The writer of this letter warns them bluntly that if they want to eat, they need to work.

A reading from the second letter to the Thessalonians.

Now we command you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from every brother or sister living irresponsibly and not according to the tradition that they received from us. For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not irresponsible when we were with you, and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day so that we might not burden any of you. This was not because we do not have that right but in order to give you an example to imitate. For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: anyone unwilling to work should not eat. For we hear that some of you are living irresponsibly, mere busybodies, not doing any work. Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

The Department of International Affairs of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A. invited the Hymn Society of America to seek new hymns for the Fifth World Order Study Conference held in Cleveland in November 1958. This one by William W. Reid Jr. was the first choice from over 200 submissions. Reid was born in New York City. He studied at Oberlin College and Yale Divinity School. In 1946 he married another pastor, Margaret Latsha, and together they served Congregational churches in North Dakota. He was a minister at Methodist churches in Pennsylvania, superintendent of the Wilkes-Barre district of the United Methodist Church, and a delegate to Methodist conferences. LLANGLOFFAN is a traditional Welsh melody. Its first publication has been traced to Llwybrau Moliant (1872), a Baptist tune collection. Some scholars believe that the tune may have spread from England to Wales in the 18th or 19th century. The title may refer to the "Church of St. Gloffan." HYMN OF THE DAY ELW 713






Remembering, therefore, his death, resurrection, and ascension, we await his coming in glory.

Isaac Watts based this hymn on Psalm 90. He wrote it in 1714, at a time when Oueen Anne was near death and all of England was anxious about her successor. Many feared that England would be divided by civil strife upon her death. This is undoubtedly Watts's greatest hymn. Long considered the father of modern English hymnody, Watts wrote more than 600 hymns and paraphrases. William Croft is thought to have written the tune ST. ANNE while he was organist at St. Anne's Church in Soho, London, England. St. Anne was the mother of the Virgin Mary, the mother of Jesus. This tune was not used with these words by Watts until 1861. Croft was born in Ettington, England, in 1678, and served as organist at Westminster Abbey. He was buried there following his death in 1727.


