#### **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

"God of Grace and God of Glory" was written in 1930 by Harry Emerson Fosdick for the dedication of the famous Riverside Church in New York City, where he was the founding pastor. It was written while the United States was in the throes of the Great Depression between the two World Wars. Fosdick was a champion of the social gospel, a movement that recognized the plight of the poor. He wrote the text to be sung to the stately REGENT SQUARE (usually sung to "Angels from the Realms of Glory"). Methodist hymnologist and hymnal editor Robert G. McCuthan, however, first paired it with the Welsh tune CWM RHONDDA for the 1935 Methodist Hymnal. It was an immediate success and the new coupling has been almost universally adopted. Fosdick disapproved strongly of the new pairing. When Carlton Young, United Methodist Hymnal editor, asked the poet why he continued to oppose the use of CWM RHONDDA with his text, Fosdick replied, "My views are well known—you Methodists have always been a bunch of wise guys."



**READING** GENESIS 3:8-15

Immediately after Adam and Eve eat the forbidden fruit, they hide from God. Neither takes responsibility for their sin, instead blaming each other, the snake, and even God. The curse on the snake was understood as a messianic

prophecy by the early church, who associated

Eve's "offspring" with Christ.

A reading from Genesis, the third chapter.

[Adam and Eve] heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden.

But the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" He said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself."

He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate." Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent tricked me, and I ate."

The Lord God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel."

But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—"I believed, and so I spoke" —we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered.

"Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin" — for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit."

In response to charges that he is possessed, Jesus wonders aloud how anyone who is demonpossessed can cast out demons. Those who do the will of God are possessed by the Holy Spirit, siblings of Christ.

Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you." And he replied, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."





#### **HYMN OF THE DAY**

## Who Is My Mother, Who Is My Brother?









#### **Hymn Commentary,** continued from left column

Shirley Erena Murray was born in Invercargill, New Zealand, in 1931. She died in 2020. Her hymns have been published in over 100 collections worldwide, and more than 30 composers have set her hymns to music. Jane Marshall wrote the tune HELEN in 1996. Marshall taught at Southern Methodist University's Perkins School of Theology and its Church Music Summer School from 1975 to 2010. She wrote more than 200 hymns and sacred choral works, collaborated often with other hymn writers, and encouraged many students.

Today's gospel and an experience at the seventh assembly of the World Council of Churches, Canberra, Australia, in 1991 provided hymnwriter Shirley Erena Murray the context for this hymn. *Murray wrote:* The fierce stimulus for writing this hymn came from sharing worship with two quite different groups who felt neglected and excluded at the WCC Assembly, namely, the "differently abled" (their own term) and the gay/lesbian members—neither of which groups felt welcome. I realized that when I wrote of "sitting at the table," most singers would assume this to be the table of the Church. But my intention was to widen our perception of the table of the world, and all the kinds of people Jesus ate with and counted as family. This is to express, too, that the Spirit is not confined to the people or rituals of the Church, but brings together whoever will "sit with Jesus"

Graham Kendrick revels here in the feast God provides—with trumpets, welcome, thankful song, lavish good things, love and light, and water turned to wine. Kendrick, the son of a Baptist minister in Northamptonshire, is one of the most prolific Christian singersongwriters in the United Kingdom. Since releasing his first album in 1972, he has written and recorded more than 450 songs. Kendrick has received honorary doctorates in divinity from Brunel University and Wycliffe College. In 1987 he helped co-found the March for Jesus, which today is a global phenomenon in which Christians take their faith to the streets in a celebration of Christ. In 1995 Kendrick received a Dove Award for his international work.







This beautiful Pentecost hvmn celebrates God's aift of the Holy Spirit. Written by the Rev. Bryan Jeffery Leech in 1976, the uplifting melody carries the poetry of a true wordsmith. Leech was born in Middlesex. England in 1931. He came to the United States in 1955 and studied at Barrington College and North Park Seminary. He was ordained in 1961 and served in the Covenant Church. He composed more than 500 songs. His tune, LOIS, is named in honor of Lois Bock, wife of Leech's collaborator, publisher, and friend, Fred Bock.

Edward Mote wrote this text on the "Gracious Experience of a Christian" during 1834. While he spent his professional life as a cabinetmaker, at age 55 he constructed a church building for a Baptist congregation in Horsham, England. He then became their pastor and served the church for the next 21 years. William Bradbury wrote the tune SOLID ROCK for Mote's text in 1863 and added the refrain at that time. He was one of the foremost composers of early gospel music in the United States. He not only served as church organist but organized many music festivals at Baptist Tabernacle in New York City.




