God is a cup of cold water when we thirst. God offers boundless grace when we fail. Claim the gift of God's mercy: you are freed and forgiven in the name of ⊕ Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

OLD HUNDREDTH is perhaps the best known and most widely used of all psalm tunes. It came into English use in 1561 with this paraphrase of Psalm 100 by William Kethe, and has been associated with it ever since. The tune is attributed to Louis Bouraeois, who was born in Paris and worked closely with the **Protestant Reformation** leader John Calvin in Geneva, Switzerland, from 1545 to 1557. Bourgeois adapted and harmonized many French psalter tunes despite Calvin's admonition against partsinging in worship..

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

READING EXODUS 19:2-8A

At Sinai God assured Israel, "You shall be my treasured possession," and commissioned them to serve as mediating priests for the nations. The people commit themselves completely to God's will. A reading from Exodus, the nineteenth chapter.

[The Israelites] had journeyed from Rephidim, entered the wilderness of Sinai, and camped in the wilderness; Israel camped there in front of the mountain. Then Moses went up to God; the Lord called to him from the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the Israelites: You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. Now therefore, if you obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession out of all the peoples. Indeed, the whole earth is mine, but you shall be for me a priestly kingdom and a holy nation. These are the words that you shall speak to the Israelites." So Moses came, summoned the elders of the people, and set before them all these words that the Lord had commanded him. The people all answered as one: "Everything that the Lord has spoken we will do." Moses reported the words of the people to the Lord.

HOLY GOSPEL MATTHEW 9:35–10:8

El Santo Evangelio según Mateo, capítulos nueve y diez.

The Holy Gospel according to Matthew, the ninth and tenth chapters. **Glory to you, O Lord.** (*¡Gloria a ti, oh Señor!*)

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment."

THE HOMILY PASTOR DOROTHY

Georgia Harkness created this hymn to reflect the theme of the Second General Assembly of the World Council of Churches—"Jesus Christ the Hope of the World." She was ordained a Methodist minister in 1926 and had a celebrated career as a college and seminary professor. John Albert Jeffery composed the tune ANCIENT OF DAYS in 1886. He was born in Plymouth. England, and succeeded his father as organist at St. Andrew's Cathedral in that city.

For fathers and father figures, we pray. Console all who long to be fathers, children estranged from their fathers, anyone grieving the death of a father, and fathers who have lost a child. Draw near to all for whom this day stirs up difficult emotions. God, in your mercy,








EUCHARISTIC PRAYER
